 Data Profiles: Detailed descriptions of data sources, including collection methods, questions answered and data limitations. These profiles enhance ADHS's transparency about its data.

ADHS Reports: Access public reports on selected public health topics. Visual analytics tools help you interpret data trends. Reports are also available for interlibrary loan from the Arizona State Library, Archives, and Public Records.

AZ Care Check: Search for licensing history information, including deficiencies and enforcement actions against facilities and providers by the Arizona Department of Health Services. This searchable database provides detailed records on licensing and compliance.



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Licensing Provider and Facility Databases: View and download databases of healthcare facilities and providers licensed by ADHS, updated monthly. These databases support efficient and responsive customer service.

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Arizona Genealogy: Use this tool to view birth records available 75 years after the date of birth and death records 50 years after the date of death.



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Healthcare Provider Revocation: Search a centralized database for health professional license revocations and surrenders that occurred between July 1, 2019, and July 1, 2024. This database is updated monthly.



Health Professionals Workforce Repository: View data on medical professionals licensed by Arizona Boards of Health, such as physicians and nurses.

- Search and Explore Map-Based Content: Discover a variety of health-related data visualized on interactive maps.Explore key health indicators and trends across Arizona, such as disease prevalence, vaccination rates, and more.
- Access Spatial Data (GIS) Assets: View and interact with detailed geospatial datasets representing public health metrics. Analyze the geographic distribution of health outcomes, healthcare access, and other critical factors.
- Utilize Web Mapping Applications: Use specialized mapping tools for advanced data analysis and visualization. Customize map views, zoom in on specific regions, and explore health data in a dynamic and actionable way.

GIS Portal:



The GIS Open Data Portal is the agency's platform for discovering, exploring and downloading ADHS authoritative geospatial datasets. An application gallery is planned for the future.

- Data Download: Allows users to preview datasets, filter data using queries, and download data snapshots in spatial (file geodatabase, shapefile), tabular (*.csv) and Google Earth (KML) formats.
- **Connect Directly to Data:** A REST API allows users to build apps and conduct analysis using dynamic data access, ensuring the most current data is used. When updates are published, they are automatically reflected in the data.
- Intuitive Access: Effortlessly find and access relevant geospatial information and tools.

This portal is ideal for partnering agencies and the public to find trusted ADHS geospatial data, services and applications related to state licensed healthcare facilities, environmental health, EMS and preparedness and other topics of interest related to public health.
